Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 3745-300-10(D), Ohio's Voluntary Action Program (VAP) allows for the voluntary cleanup of contaminated property in Ohio without the risk of state civil liability. Under VAP, ground water cleanup is required where contaminated ground water poses risks to the community or environment.

An Urban Setting Designation (USD) may be requested for properties participating in the VAP when there is not current or anticipated future use of ground water by local residents for drinking, showering, bathing, or cooking. In these areas, an approved USD would lower the cost of cleanup and promote economic redevelopment, while still protecting public health and safety.

Ohio EPA's Director may approve the request for a USD based on a demonstration by the certified professional that the USD requirements are met and an evaluation of existing or future uses of ground water in the area have been assessed.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for the subject transportation project. The purpose of the project is to replace a culvert over an unnamed tributary to Rock Creek along U.S. 322 at SLM 10.30 in Colebrook Township, Ashtabula County, Ohio. The current 9' by 9' box culvert was determined structurally deficient by district engineers. The proposed 10' by 4' culvert will meet current design standards and provide two 12-foot lanes and a 12-foot shoulder. The proposed culvert is 28 feet longer than the existing culvert. Three streams and two Category 3 wetlands are proposed for impact, resulting in 0.07 acre (592 linear feet) of fill in streams and 0.16 acre of fill in wetlands. The wetlands involved with the project are located within the Grand River watershed (HUC: 04110004). The Huntington District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Number for this project is LRH-2007-626-UT to Rock Creek. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 103610.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would involve impacts to 3 streams, totaling 592 feet, and two wetlands totaling 0.16 acre. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would involve impacts to 3 streams, totaling 562 feet, and two wetlands totaling 0.03 acre. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on streams or wetlands but would not meet the purpose and need for the project. Both the preferred and minimal degradation alternatives would involve impacts to Category 3 wetlands. The applicant is seeking certification for the preferred alternative. Stream and wetland mitigation will be provided in accordance with Ohio EPA's Wetlands Water Quality Standards.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of the water quality to wetlands and streams in the the Grand River watershed (HUC 04110004). The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation, or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule (effective as of May 1, 1998), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification for the realignment of Byers Road (MOT-Byers Road, PID 79492). The application was submitted by the Montgomery County Transportation Improvement District. The project is located north of Miamisburg-Springboro Road in Miami Township and the city of Miamisburg in Montgomery County, Ohio. The Huntington District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for this project is LRH-2008-315-GMR. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 093592.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, rule 3745-1-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would impact 250 linear feet of intermittent stream, and 1.25 acres of Category I and II wetlands. The preferred alternative would upgrade and relocate portions of Byers Road. Improvements would include widening of existing two-lane sections to four lanes with a center two-way left turn lane or raised median, and the additions of a sidewalk along the east side and a multi-use path along the west. The project will also construct approximately 1.1 miles of roadway on new location to relocate the existing southern terminus of Byers Road at Miamisburg-Springboro Pike 1500 feet west, and create a four-leg intersection where Wood Road currently terminates at Miamisburg-Springboro Pike from the south.

The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would impact 500 linear feet of intermittent stream, and 0.48 acres of Category I wetlands. The minimal degradation alternative combines the existing staggered T-intersections on Miamisburg-Springboro Pike at Byers and Wood Roads, using Medlar Road as part of its alignment. This alternative would provide a roadway facility that meets current roadway design standards and would accommodate the future traffic volumes. However, aligned on the very west of the land planned for development, its location would not accommodate the local land-use plan and would limit the potential for economic development in the immediate area and would not fully meet the purpose and need for this project.

The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state. The no build alternative would not accommodate the future traffic volumes or provide a roadway facility that meets current roadway design standards. It would not permit left turns in or out of existing Byers Road at Miamisburg-Springboro Pike after the Austin Pike Interchange is opened and thus would not provide

the local mobility requirements to accommodate the local land-use plan and support economic development. For these reasons, the non degradation alternative would not meet the purpose and need for this project and is not acceptable.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of an unnamed tributary of Clear Creek in the Great Miami River watershed. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. All three proposed alternatives will be considered during the review process. No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by OAC rule 3745-1-05, apply or may be granted.
